Can Canada Stay Bilingual? Coalition Says Oui and that It's Time for Action

Linguistic Duality Network introduces new name, new logo and a refined mandate at the service of Canada's Official Languages.

Ottawa, December 2, 2025 – The Linguistic Duality Network, one of the few voices in Canada dedicated to strengthening official languages, is pleased to announce its relaunch under a new name: the Coalition for Official Languages. This renewed direction is the result of extensive consultations held throughout early 2025, during which key interest groups examined shared challenges facing Canada's official languages and the need to better engage the majority of Canadians.

Founded by Canadian Parents for French, French for the Future, and the Dialogue Network, the original Linguistic Duality Network helped establish an important space for collaboration in an environment often marked by silos. Its evolution reflects a growing need for coordinated and collective impact.

"The realities and needs of Canada's linguistic communities are increasingly diverse and continue to shift," said Derrek Bentley, Network CEO of Canadian Parents for French. "What remains constant is the role of language as a catalyst for nation-building, opportunity, education, employment, community development, and human connection. The Coalition for Official Languages emerges precisely at that crossroads between change and continuity."

At its core, the new name reflects the need for a stronger, more unified voice to engage the majority of Canadians on official languages. The founding organizations of the Coalition for Official Languages envision a country where everyone has the opportunity to live, learn, use, and participate actively in both official languages if they desire.

The Coalition is committed to rallying partners and interest groups around these shared goals in order to:

- Set ambitious and achievable national targets for bilingualism rates;
- Address structural and systemic barriers that limit the vitality of Canada's official languages for all;
- Mobilize knowledge that strengthens connection, respect, and understanding between linguistic groups;
- Create opportunities for sustained and collaborative action across the country.

The refreshed brand and visual identity will roll out across all platforms beginning in December 2025, with further initiatives and announcements planned throughout 2026.
